had monitored the Weavers for 18 months. Yet they never told the FBI about this. Instead, they suggested that the FBI shoot anyone who carried a weapon outside the house.

That order led to the death of Vicki Weaver. The sniper who shot her, Lon Horiuchi, blew her head off. Horiuchi was trained to hit a quarter-inch target from 200 yards. Yet at the trial he testified that it was "accidental" and he was trying to hit someone else.

The Marshall's Service also reported to the FBI that the Weavers attacked the government, killed an officer, and had the government "pinned down in a fire fight." This too was a lie. The Service had told the FBI that Mrs. Weaver was a religious fanatic who intended to kill her children and then herself. But there was no evidence of any of it. In fact, she was a good Christian and a fine wife and mother.

Further, they did not mention that they had shot Weaver's son in the back the day before the FBI arrived. The FBI did not find out about it until they discovered the boy's body. The FBI now claims it thought he was shot by someone in the family.

Other troubling aspects of the case include entrapment. The reason the government was interested in the Weavers was because he sawed off a shotgun. But the BATF solicited Weaver to cut it a quarter-inch short and sell the guns to an undercover agent. The government paid Weaver \$300 to commit the "crime" they later used to justify their siege.

A U.S. Marshal was shot only after Weaver's son had been killed. A federal jury acquitted the Weavers for this. The Justice Department is reviewing the case under the auspices of the Office of Professional Responsibility. If the final report follows the tradition of its report on Waco, it will be a whitewash.

### The ADL Gets Off Scot Free

More than a year ago, the Anti-Defamation League office in San Francisco was caught illegally buying confidential police and other government records in pursuit of groups thought to be anti-Semitic. The uproar caused

firings at the ADL., but in court, it got off easy.

The District Attorney in San Francisco agreed to drop the investigation. The Anti-Defamation League agreed to spend \$75,000 in San Francisco "combating bigotry." The ADL did not admit to any wrongdoing. But they promised not to obtain confidential information from any California state or local law enforcement officer in the future.

A woman who represented one of the organizations spied upon was not happy. "Not only is there no admission of guilt," she said "but the ADL are portrayed as good Samaritans waving the flag against bigotry." Evidence indicated the ADL monitored such groups as the Davidians in Waco, and may have helped instigate the attack.

### The CFR

The Council on Foreign Relations, organized in 1921, started publishing its journal *Foreign Affairs* 70 years ago. Most Americans have never heard of the journal and quite possibly have never heard of the CFR. In the early years the CFR was very secretive and only the newsletter industry along with the John Birch Society ever mentioned it or tried to explain its program and power.

Times have changed. Ever since the early 1980s when Ronald Reagan, who was once a critic of the CFR and the Trilateral Commission, hosted the Trilateral Commission in the White House, there has been much more openness and boldness on the part of both of these organizations.

A blunt explanation and analysis of the CFR's importance appeared in the *Washington Post* of all places last October. Even ten years ago, information like this would not have appeared. It was quite frank about the influence of the CFR on U.S. policy.

In talking about *Foreign Affairs*, journalist Richard Harwood said "The quarterly is published by the Council on Foreign Relations, whose members are the nearest thing we have to a ruling establishment in the United States." The President, the Secretary of State, the Deputy Secretary of State and all five of the undersecretaries, several of the assistant secretaries and the department's legal advisor are all members. Likewise the National Security Advisor and his deputy are members.

Every Director of the CIA has been a member of the CFR. Additional members of the CFR are the current Secretary of Defense, three undersecretaries and at least four assistant secretaries of defense, as well as the secretaries of HUD, Interior, Health and Human Services, and White House press man David Gergen. Harwood also notes that the Speaker of the House and the Majority Leader of the Senate are members.

The new editor of *Foreign Affairs* is the former publisher of the *New York Daily News*. It all started with Walter Lippmann, who was the director of the Council in the 1930s. Harwood points out that more than 10% of the membership is made up of the media. Katharine Graham, the owner of the *Washington Post*, is a member of the CFR. Other media figures in the CFR include Dan Rather, Tom Brokaw, Jim Lehrer, Charles Krauthammer, William Buckley, and George Will.

The most outstanding statement in this article came in Harwood's description of the symbiosis between the establishment media and foreign policy. "They [the journalists] do not merely analyze and interpret foreign policy for the United States, they help make it."

It is a sad commentary on our times that the establishment press feels that there is no downside to publishing such information. On the other hand, revolutions occur just when establishments feel they are in perfect control of the situation.

### Hello, Hemlo

Hemlo Gold Mines, with about 450,000 ounces in annual production, is smaller than Homestake or Placer Dome, but no one in North America can beat its cost of production at \$130 per ounce.

Hemlo is basically a one-mine company, with 90% of its production from the Golden Giant mine in Hemlo, Ontario. And with total gold reserves of almost 4.5 million ounces at the complex, there is 12 years of additional production.

The Golden Giant grosses \$100 million a year at \$375 gold, but it also creates a dilemma. Management must try to duplicate that success, which may be impossible. Currently, Hemlo is developing two projects, the New World in Montana and the Holloway in northeastern Ontario, with reserves of two million ounces and a possible 150,000 ounce annual production in several years. Operating costs at New World and Holloway will be about \$200 an ounce, which is classified as low, but is still 60% higher than current costs. Hemlo is also looking for other new gold deposits in North America, with an annual exploration budget of \$12 million.

With Hemlo's low cost of production and reserve life of 12 years, the company will be very profitable through the entire current bull market in gold. Earnings for the first nine months of 1993 were \$0.25 per share. In response to higher gold prices in 1993, the company paid 7.5 per share on top of its normal dividend of 15. Hemlo Gold trades on the ASE at around \$10½ under the symbol "HEM."

### Guns Are Safe

The vicious attack on gun ownership by the Clinton administration is not out of concern for street violence and the safety of American citizens. It is to disarm the people, through registration or confiscation or both. And as writer Samuel Francis points out, the vast majority of guns are used to deter crime, not to commit it.
